YOUTH: Sophia Martin

Sophia, an Oconomowoc High School student, made 40 tie blankets and donated them to our 2023 Toy Shop. Blankets, quilts and sleeping bags are extremely popular gifts at Toy Shop and every one of the blankets she donated is being snuggled by a happy child. The enterprising Sophia enlisted the support of the Oconomowoc Public Library as a collection site for generous community members to donate fleece.



BUSINESS: Hydrite Chemical Corp.

Hydrite and its employees have been actively involved in CCC for more than a decade. The company has donated funds each year since 2013, sponsored children in 2021 and sponsored our 2022 Jingle Bell Jog. These treasures are created by a small group of women with a winning combination of patience, talent and love. They are popular items chosen by our Toy Shop clients and used as lap quilts, covers for doll beds and floor mats for infant play time.

Shannon, an experienced professional, owns Shannon Rose Photography in Waukesha and specializes in family, senior and branding photography.
